Seattle First (today branded as Grow Seattle) is a multi-disciplinary advisory committee of private and public members from state county and local agencies working together with the intention of retaining industrial businesses in Seattle's urban community. This program is co-sponsored by the Manufacturing Industrial Council and the City of Seattle's Office Economic Development

SODO Inc. was a training program for 18-24 year old at-risk (or already caught up) youth designed to expose them to the industrial trades. The program provides safety and job readiness training coupled with on-the-job internships at local industrial businesses. Partners for this program included King County Department of Human Services – Youth Source, Puget Sound Industrial Excellence Center of South Seattle Community College and the Aerospace Joint Apprenticeship Committee.
